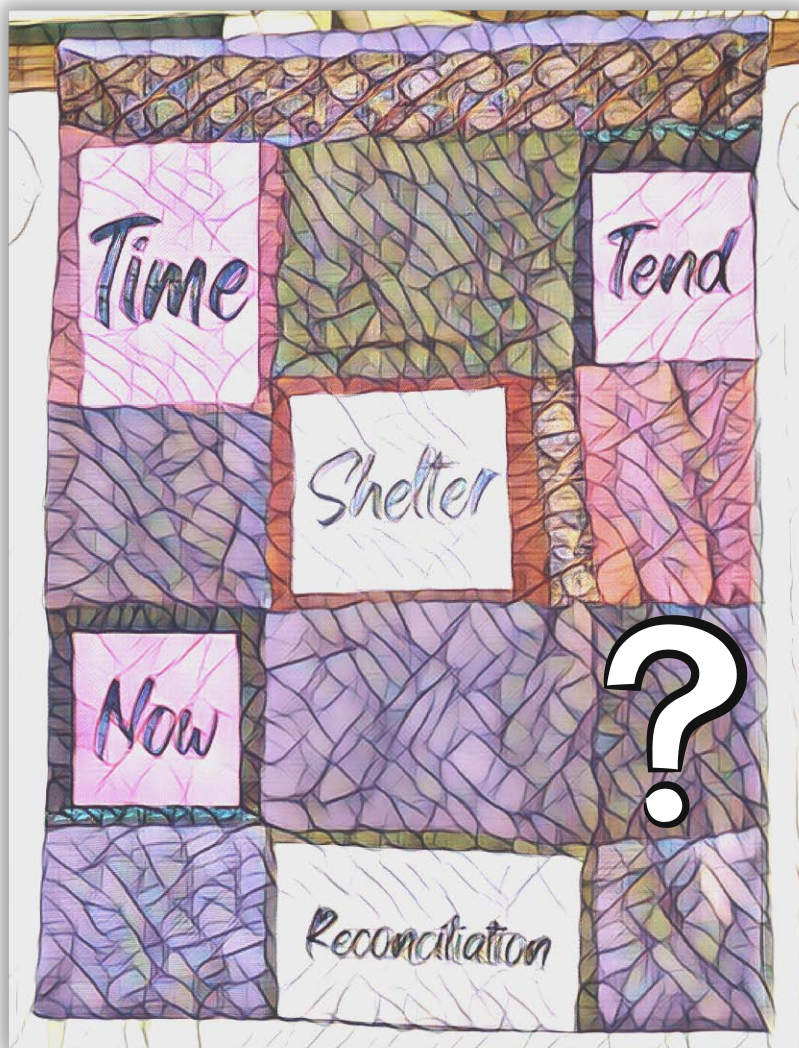

A LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Ones,

I think this is the last newsletter letter I will be writing. Gulp. I have just over three weeks before my last workday (three weeks and 2 days but who's counting?). I force myself to contend with this in my thoughts and prayers every day now that I have crossed the one-month threshold. It is wicked hard. I cannot begin to tell all that I will miss. Mostly I will miss YOU, my precious, squirrely, passionate, sometimes crabby, and often dazzlingly kind and hard-working church family.

Almost eight years ago (it would be a full eight years in June), I was called to this church in ways that made my heart sing. I loved the NSBUCC commitment to inclusivity, our support for the LGBTQ+ community and our determination to feed the hungry. Every church on the planet BELIEVES they are welcoming, but this church REALLY IS! We find a place for folks, and we sit beside them... we get to know them and if they are children, we love them even as they wiggle and make lighting the candles EXTRA exciting.

As I try to prepare my heart for letting go and letting God (as the saying, and true discipleship, goes) I am comforted by watching you all in action. Last night we had a fabulous craft night and delicious supper provided by Bill Peterson's stellar cooking skills. I hate crafts, but when I see you guys in action, I have to love them! Natalie was a genius to come up with a craft that everyone (well, not me but normal people!) could do and to create a reason with Bill and David's supper support to call us all together. How we have MISSED being together! Honestly, the crafts shocked me! The spring wreaths you made were so CREATIVE and each one had a person's personality in a clothespin circle that would brighten any spot. They actually looked beautiful! (I know I shouldn't have been surprised, shocked even, but... well... I was.)

Our theme for lent this year is “Tending one another with care.” We have put a new word that connects with this theme in a pocket of the new pulpit parament that Debby made for this season. It is an important theme and rededication for our body the church at NSBUCC because COVID kept us back from each other for so long. The more isolated we were through social distancing and lack of indoor time...hugging and laughing, listening, and holding hands while we prayed... the more sadness, crabbiness, and self-centered some of our interactions became. The problem was that being alone so much gave us too much time to dwell on what WE wanted and liked and not enough time noticing what OTHERS wanted, needed even. This has been no one’s “fault”, it has been a side effect of protecting ourselves and others during the pandemic, which was important, but our joy of connection became harder to come by. The joy for me now, even as I prepare for the terribly hard work of moving, is that I see RECONNECTION blossoming. Inch by inch, we are coming back to our true nature as Christ’s body in New Smyrna Beach. I celebrate and thank God for this blessing.

I also notice the problem-solving skills alive and at work among you. Our church council, guided by our moderator and vice moderator, are tackling complex maintenance problems and overseeing strategic planning in a way that will stand us in good stead as we move forward. Our search committee perfected a church profile to submit to the Florida Conference for posting to attract a designated minister who will feel called by who we are in this body and the sacred work we are doing in our community.

The search committee is well on its way of receiving profiles from interested clergy, listening to them preach online, checking references and lining up interviews. Your search committee embodies diversity from our membership of age and life experiences, but each member has a heart for listening to the sacred call...

...God is even now placing in the heart of the person who will come to us and the hearts of those who will hear that call on our behalf. They will recommend someone to you at the end of the process. YOU, as the Body of Christ, will have the final vote as you did almost 8 years ago. Our search committee is amazing, Sammie, the chair, was on the search committee that called me. The key point is that as they search, they search their hearts for God's nudges, so the connection NSBUCC makes with the next clergy person grows the Body as the Holy Spirit calls.

John motioned to move Colors of Hunger back inside the Community Hall. Karen Austin seconded the motion and the vote was unanimous to do so. At John's request Council voted to allow Volusia County's Children's Summer Food Program to take place at our church parking lot. This will be a drive thru "food to go" program for school age children. It will run from June 6th thru August 10th from 10-12 every day. Volunteers are also needed for this awesome program.

Membership Report: Karen Austin – meetings are starting up again and she is looking forward to coordinating with pastoral group. Tee Shirt sales are going well, please remember shirts can be obtained on Sunday after church.

In the end we were relieved to learn that there is no evidence of live termites in any area inside the sanctuary so it was decided that we will simply remove the wooden alter and the wooden Narthex doors since they are the only areas current with activity. Big sigh of relief! As Debby reminds us every Sunday, WE (all of us) ARE the Property Committee until the position is filled. There is a book in the office with a form to fill out if we notice any areas of concern in our buildings that may need to be addressed.

STICKY NOTE SEMINARY

with Castor Welsh

Greetings Church Family!

On **Sunday, April 24th** after church (about 11:00 AM), join Castor Welsh for the first ever meeting of the Sticky Note Seminary! This group will be dissecting the Bible, and various corresponding narratives, annotation style (or sticky notes if you will).

During each meeting, attendants will go over each other's annotations of the text, discovering the roots of their own initial impressions, and exploring how the experiences of their peers have shaped different understandings of the content, further deepening one another's knowledge of the Bible and reality.

For the first meeting we will be reading Austen Hartke's "Transforming: The Bible and the Lives of Transgender Christians". While you certainly will not need to purchase or read the book to learn something while attending the meetings, it is highly encouraged, as it will help you to develop insights by creating and sharing your own annotations of the text. You can purchase the book on Amazon for \$16.00 (paperback) or \$9.99 for the kindle version. You can also borrow the audiobook version on the Hoopla app (the digital service utilized by the Volusia county library to lend e-books and audiobooks).
