### **Message from Pastor Diane**

### Dear Ones,

This Sunday will be Pentecost Sunday. That is a very big deal. Pentecost is the day we celebrate the memory of the Holy Spirit coming into Christ's fledgling church... the day we actually became a church. A church was born when the Holy Spirit blew into a gathering of disciples. Scripture tells us (read all of Acts 2) that "they were all together in one place". *They were all together*. That's when the Holy Spirit came. The Spirit blew in like a violent wind... no soft, "What do you think that was?" moment. There was a strong wind no one would miss and there appeared flames like tongues of fire which rested on each one of them and they were filled, FILLED, with the Holy Spirit. This was not a sprinkling, or a gentle dusting, the Holy Spirit FILLED THEM RIGHT UP. They over flowed, speaking in tongues... not a weird, spooky mystery language, but real words that foreign people could hear and UNDERSTAND. When the Holy Spirit came everything was changed for the disciples... on the inside of their hearts and outside for the strangers gathered around. When they were all together, the Holy Spirit came in ways that could never be denied.

This Pentecost, I wonder what our gathering will look like. It is a blessing that we can have folks far away gathering through Zoom, but some folks way closer than Wisconsin have been joining on Zoom. At this point, out of an abundance of caution, we are only allowing fully immunized people (and the occasional unvaccinated child who is with a vaccinated parent). By now most of us are immunized and a few of us are simply waiting for the second shot to reach its effectiveness. But some of us, despite the CDC invitation for immunized folks to gather together and feel safe do not yet feel safe. Some of us, for rare medical reasons, have been advised against immunization. I know one person who, though immunized, resists coming back until ALL people (including those who aren't immunized) can join us. Others of us have just grown so comfortable on our own couches with a cup of coffee that it is not feeling as desirable to dress up and drive to sit down in the sanctuary. We are an eclectic group with a wide and odd range of reasons for not being in the sanctuary.

But Pentecost is coming. The disciples were gathered in one place. I am hoping that as many folks as possible will join us in the sanctuary. There is a special Holy Spirit power that courses through folks who have gathered for worship. I miss having a sizable group of us. Pentecost is coming.

We have upped our air circulation game in the sanctuary with a new, improved capability to zap the air being filtered with an ultraviolet purifier. We clean and reclean. We have hand sanitizer. We are not requiring masks, but anyone feeling more secure in a mask is very welcome to wear one. If you are thinking about coming to the sanctuary, please try it! I believe it is safe, way safer than our local grocery stores. But know that however we gather, through Zoom or in person, the Holy Spirit will find us, moving, healing, connecting, and filling our hearts. Come if you can. Wear red if you can. But know the love of God that finds and fills us still.

Veni, Sancte Spiritus is known as the Golden Sequence, and is sung as a Gregorian chant during Catholic Mass on Pentecost Sunday. It is commonly regarded as one of the greatest masterpieces of sacred Latin poetry ever written. Its beauty and depth have been praised by many.

The hymn has been attributed to three different authors, King Robert II the Pious of France (970-1031), Pope Innocent III (1161-1216), and Stephen Langton (d 1228), Archbishop of Canterbury, of which the last is most likely the author.

Debby opened with a prayer (meeting started at 6:05 pm)

Secretary, Minutes from Apr 12, 2021 One correction noted and made. Motion to approve as amended (Doreen, Frances) unanimously approved.

Moderator Report— The prayer chain ministry is very growing. As part of this Gail Besaw continues to stay on top of those in need of cards and she funds this activity on her own.

Pastor's Report—Pastor is very pleased with the progress made toward creating a combined worship – In-Sanctuary and ZOOM. Pastor also expressed her excitement for Lara Nance's Health Care Ministry. The newly designed Sunday School Room is complete – drop by and take a look – it's awesome!

Financial Report, March-Gary Smith filled in for Tom & Hal and shared the financial reports and the updates for April. Net Income is up for April by \$4,826 and \$20,629 YTD. Some annual tithes were received in the month. Attendance was down about 20% from last year.

### Committee Chair Reports:

Property – New Thermostats that can be monitored via cell phone will be installed. Ronnie, George and Bobby are looking for an appropriate vendor and will also be evaluating cost of service contracts on all units.

Education – Absent, no report.

Hospitality/ COH - Absent, no report.

Thrift Store – Short on volunteers as snowbirds head north. Interviewed 2 possible candidates today. Frances will not be in the store and will be unavailable from June 3 – Jun 19 due to a medical issue. Volunteers are asked to coordinate with Lori Lee who is doing scheduling. Frances mentioned that she needs large brown paper grocery bags. Bill P. suggested we ask the congregation to ask for these when they shop and then bring them to the Thrift Store to recycle.

Membership— Doreen indicated that she would like to place an order for T-shirts, however she needs to know who is interested and what color and size they need. She has black t-shirts available but does not have any lavender. We ran the informational piece in the VOICE and will do it again in our next issue. UCC NSB T-shirts—prices have increased \$15 for members; \$20 for non-members with an additional charge for 2x, 3x, and 4x.

Worship - Lara Nance has stepped down as Worship Chair and Alice Lewis has been accepted the interim position. Alice appreciates the opportunity.

### **Old Business:**

In-Sanctuary Worship – already covered in Pastor's report Website Redesign – in progress

### **New Business:**

Beatitude Health Care – Lara provided an update on her practice. She is in the process of submitting grants for operational funding. She is utilizing resources from a local church as well as Little Drugstore.

Farmers Market Rentals – A couple of vendors have been unable to secure space a the local farmers market and have asked if they can rent space on our lawn. Dave LeBlanc has volunteered to work with city to secure the proper licenses.

The meeting adjourned at 7:30 after a closing prayer given by Pastor Diane. The next meeting will be held on Tuesday, June 15 at 6:00p via ZOOM.

NOTE: A special vote was taken on May 14th via email as a result of the CDC decision regarding COVID. The council voted that we would continue to open worship only to those vaccinated, however, masks would be optional.


