## Message from Pastor Diane

Dear Ones,

I am really looking forward to observing Ash Wednesday with as many of you as possible this coming Wednesday, February 17, at 6 PM. Please set a reminder on your phone to nudge you in enough time to set up the ashes in a small bowl (either ashes you received from your church family in the mail, or, for those of you further away...ashes that you have prepared yourself). If you have questions about preparing your own ashes, please do not hesitate to call my cell # (386-847-0883) or email me directly at [mytoadhill@hotmail.com](mailto:mytoadhill@hotmail.com).

In truth, any ashes will do, we will bless them at the beginning of worship. Some folks find it meaningful to burn some twigs that they find near their homes. Others write either prayers or confessions on small papers and burn them in a wok or frying pan. Both produce meaningful ashes. If it is a zillion below zero where you live and you are not interested in searching outdoors for branches or cracking a window for fresh air because you set something on fire in your kitchen... remember any ashes will do. We will bless what you have at the beginning of worship. Just gather a small amount of ashes in a bowl to place before your computer.

You will also need a bowl with warm water and a washcloth that you don't mind getting ashes on. (Don't worry, I've done this many times with even white washcloths and ashes come out in the washing machine.) So, two bowls, one with ashes and another with warm water, and a washcloth. If you have other members in your household, you will help one another with the two steps. If you live alone, you will complete the steps yourself, but remember, we are connected to Christ and to one another as we worship through the power of the Holy Spirit, so none of us will actually be alone.

**Pastor's Message (cont'd)**

Ashes are a symbol of our mortality, "You come from dust and to dust you will return," we will say, remembering on this first day of Lent, that it is Jesus' love and sacrifice for us that lays a path beyond human death to life eternal. The purpose of the Lenten journey through 40 days is to deepen our sensitivity to the call God places in our heart, to listen, respond and repeat every day. Being surrounded by COVID-19 risks in the middle of a deadly pandemic has certainly made the tenuous nature of our existence increasingly obvious and we have all taken some hard measures to try and reduce that risk. Life is precious. Lent calls us past fear of mortality to a sacred space where we can learn to hold our own lives lightly, trusting them to the ministrations of the Holy Spirit. We may develop a renewed sense of our worth and potential as we look to the One Who holds us with infinite tenderness.

Begin a Lenten journey this Wednesday with the sisters and brothers God has provided as companions in a lonely time; sisters and brothers who are comfort in the wilderness time of pandemic and spiritual challenge. Come and grow with us this Lent. Easter comes. Lent provides and opening... a slow rolling, as of a large rock... coming away from a tomb that has held us. Through Lent, Easter comes.

Debby called the meeting to order at 6:07pm. Debby opened the meeting with prayer. Ronnie confirmed a quorum was present.

**Moderator's Welcome** - Debby welcomed all to the meeting. She shared as new business her desire to roll out a call tree campaign to check in on church members and get status of vaccinations from members. She will follow-up with Bill Peterson as this is a Vice Moderator function.

**Secretary Report** - The minutes from January meeting were unanimously approved. Motions made (D. Massin/L Nance) to accept.

**Pastor's Report** - The Pastor met today with COH to get information on the plans for expanding the services and filing for their own 501(c)(3). Pastor also shared how the Prayer Group and Prayer chain have been working to meet the physical and mental health needs of our Church Family.

**Finance Report** - We ended the month basically breaking even. Tithes were up at year-end as some givers were making up the balance of their 2020 pledges. Ronnie gave an update on the Flex Insurance Policy application. She indicated that we will need to execute our Safe Church Policy and schedule background checks for all those who handle money, can sign contracts or deal with children. All materials have been submitted and we are awaiting underwriting for a quote. Insurance Board to evaluate a new program that is tailored to smaller congregations. John Buchanan gave an update on COH requesting a separate bank account. Tom provided context and details. A motion was made (D. Massin/B. Lambert) and a voter was taken to approve getting a separate bank account. The motions was approved and carried unanimously.

**Property** - Bobby shared that the Narthex door was replaced. The Thrift Store entry door threshold was repaired. Several customers / volunteers have tripped and one customer fell however there were no serious injuries. Evidence of pests (bats/squirrels) were identified in the Administration building. Massey addressed the problem and resolved it. Bobby has repaired the probably points of entry to eliminate further problems. A new concrete ramp was installed at the Thrift Store backdoor. Frances confirmed with Bobby that her request for an awning over it is still being considered for this year's budget funds permitting.

**Worship** - Lara shared information regarding the pandemic in FL and how vaccinations have progressed per CDC. Debby is planning to execute the "Call Tree" to check in with our church family offering to help them get vaccinations scheduled. Lara gave an update for Ash Wednesday and Lent. Packages of ashes along with Palm Sunday devotionals will be mailed today.

**Hospitality** - John/Donnie are planning a drive-thru meatloaf dinner in March...stay tuned.

**Membership** - Doreen indicated that she is working to help get our members and friends appointments for vaccination. If you need an appointment and have not been successful, contact Doreen.

**COH** - John announced that there will be a 50/50 event held at Down the Hatch in Ponce Inlet for the benefit of Colors of Hunger. Doreen offered to contact the News Journal and Hometown News to advertise the benefit. John/Donnie will get her the flyer information.

The Pastor led the group in a closing prayer and the meeting adjourned at 7:42p. Our next meeting will be held on March 9, 2021 at 6:00p via ZOOM.

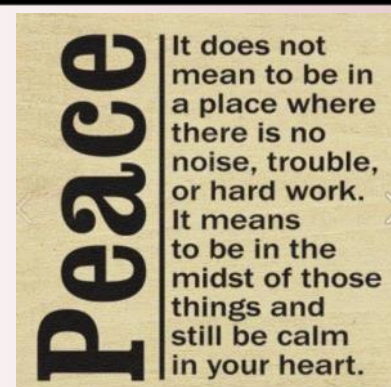
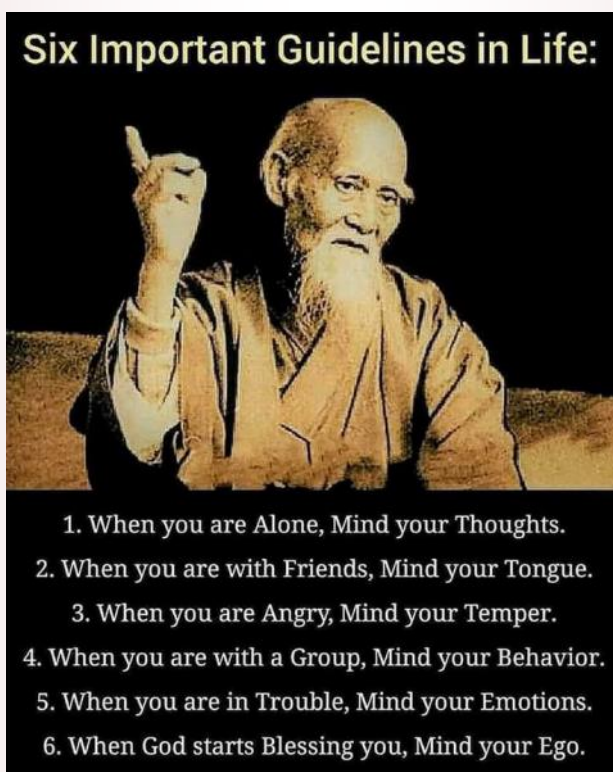

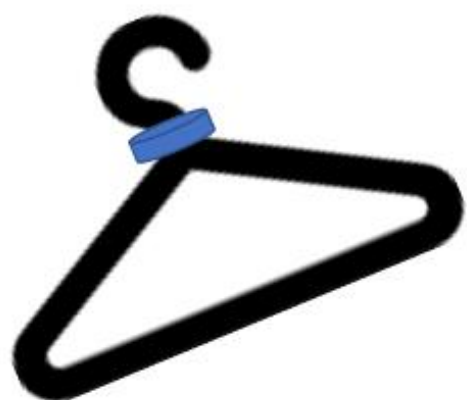

This easily accessible series will provide patients and their caregivers with helpful information and answers to your questions from medical and behavioral health experts. ### Cancer Screening/ Wellness After Cancer Treatment

Thursday, February 18, 2021, 5-6pm

***Early Screening Detection** Most people would prefer never to contract a disease in the first place—or, if they cannot avoid an illness, they prefer that it be caught early and stamped out before it causes them any harm. To accomplish this, people without specific complaints undergo interventions to identify and modify risk factors to avoid the onset of disease or to find disease early in its course so that early treatment prevents illness. When these interventions take place in clinical practice, the activity is referred to as preventive care. One type of preventive care is screening. Screening is the identification of an asymptomatic disease, harmful condition, or risk factors.*

***After treatment follow-up care** After cancer treatment, patients will have regular follow up visits to monitor their health and address any physical or emotional problems. Follow up visits can include a physical exam, labs, imaging scans, and addressing problems. Follow up care can be different for each patient depending on the type of cancer, the treatment given and overall health. The follow up care plan, along with a summary of your cancer treatment, is part of what is called a survivorship care plan. In addition to follow-up care, there are ways that patients can reduce the chances of their cancer coming back with a healthy lifestyle.*
